In the case of services provided outside of consular premises, applicants shall also pay compensation for travel expenses and, when services are provided outside the city of posting, hotel and per diem expenses.

If the service is provided by a posted official or a locally employed official at a mission abroad, payment shall be made in accordance with the rules applying to official travels. An honorary consul or a person employed at an honorary consulate is entitled to reasonable compensation for board and lodging.
