SWEDISH SCHOLARSHIPS

Annually the Swedish Institute (SI) offers a Scholarship for full-time master's studies in Sweden. The SI Scholarship focuses on students who will contribute to the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development as global leaders in their respective capacities. Six South Africans have been selected for the SI Scholarship for Global Professionals, among 250 other students globally.

Also, in addition to an existing exchange between Sweden and South Africa on Defence, it is the first time that the SI Scholarship has been awarded for studies at the Swedish Defence University – building the foundations of future collaboration.
